The State of California is the first to start installing historic U.S. 6 signage. The highway signs are being installed along the pre-1956 alignment between the Nevada State line and the City of Long Beach.

Reestablishing the historic alignment is not only a great benefit to the communities in California, but to all the communities located along the Grand Old Highway.

The measure unanimously passed both houses of the Legislature and was signed by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger in July 2007.

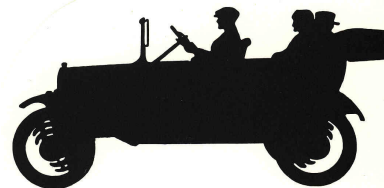
