While not always on the Route 6 site, Kathryn Barger's most impactful updates are unfolding in her work to support the **Altadena community's recovery** from the January 2025 **Eaton Fire**:

- **Debris removal** is nearly complete—95% of eligible residential sites cleared by July.
- Over \$27 million in relief funds have been distributed to households, businesses, and workers, alongside \$140 million approved in FEMA assistance.
- Barger spearheaded tools to accelerate rebuilding, including an Altadena Rebuilding
 One-Stop Center, plan self-certification, and a free Al-powered plan review tool
 (Archistar).
- An independent evaluation of evacuation and first-responder procedures is underway, with McChrystal Group delivering progress updates toward the end of July 2025.

These are not just stories of recovery—they're models of **innovative governance**, **community resilience**, **and interagency collaboration**.

Community Revitalization & Park Rebirth

Beyond emergency relief, Barger is renewing community spaces and civic life:

 In March 2025, she announced the fast-tracked reopening of Loma Alta Park, backed by a \$2.4 million FireAid/Annenberg donation. This included a playground, DREAMFields baseball facilities (supported by the Dodgers Foundation), a gym and Junior Clippers program (via Clippers Foundation), plus youth and senior services, library, and community concert space.

Her forward-thinking leadership is lighting the path not just toward recovery, but toward **thriving communal revitalization**.
