

Massachusetts

- **Provincetown – Eastern Terminus**
The official start of Route 6, with the Pilgrim Monument, Provincetown Harbor, and sweeping ocean views.
- **Cape Cod National Seashore**
Route 6 runs through pristine beaches, dunes, and historic lighthouses.
- **Fall River – Battleship Cove**
The world's largest collection of historic naval ships, visible from Route 6.

Rhode Island

- **Providence State House**
An iconic marble-domed capitol building visible from Route 6.
- **Scituate Reservoir**
Rhode Island's largest freshwater source, with scenic views from the highway.

Connecticut

- **Hartford State Capitol**
Gold-domed architectural gem directly on Route 6.
- **Willimantic Footbridge**
The longest pedestrian bridge in New England, spanning the Willimantic River.

New York

- **Bear Mountain Bridge**
A scenic Hudson River crossing that connects Route 6 between Cortlandt and Orange counties.
- **Peekskill Historic District**
A revitalized downtown filled with 19th-century charm, right on Route 6.

Pennsylvania

- **Milford – Grey Towers National Historic Site**
Home of Gifford Pinchot, first chief of the US Forest Service, along Route 6.
- **Warren Historic District**
Preserved architecture along the Allegheny River.

- **Kinzua Bridge Skywalk**

Historic viaduct turned glass overlook, on the original US 6 alignment.

Ohio

- **Lake Erie Shoreline in Vermilion**

Route 6 hugs the coast here, offering lake views and access to historic lighthouses.

- **Lorain Lighthouse**

A picturesque Great Lakes light visible from Route 6.

Indiana

- **Indiana Dunes National Park (southern boundary)**

Route 6 skirts the park, offering access to sandy beaches and dunes.

- **Hobart Downtown Historic District**

Early 20th-century architecture directly on the route.

Illinois

- **Starved Rock State Park (Ottawa)**

Famous canyons and waterfalls, minutes from Route 6.

- **Geneseo Historic District**

19th-century storefronts and homes along Route 6.

Iowa

- **Newton – Maytag Park & Bowl**

WPA-built park and amphitheater along Route 6.

- **Des Moines State Capitol**

Gold-domed capitol building as Route 6 passes through the capital.

Nebraska

- **Hastings – Birthplace of Kool-Aid**

Museum celebrating the hometown invention, right on Route 6.

- **McCook – Frank Lloyd Wright Sutton House**

Architectural landmark just off the highway.

Colorado

- **Loveland Pass (historic alignment)**

A high-altitude section once part of US 6 before the Eisenhower Tunnel.

- **Colorado National Monument (Grand Junction)**
Dramatic red rock canyons accessible from US 6.

Utah

- **Helper Historic District**
Preserved railroad town directly on Route 6.
- **Price – USU Eastern Prehistoric Museum**
Dinosaur and archaeological exhibits along the highway.

Nevada

- **Great Basin National Park**
Accessed from US 6 at Ely, featuring Lehman Caves and Wheeler Peak.
- **Tonopah Historic Mining Park**
Preserved mining equipment and buildings on Route 6.

California (*Historic pre-1964 segment*)

- **Bishop – Current Western Terminus**
Where US 6 now ends at US 395, gateway to the Sierra Nevada.
- **Long Beach – Original Western Terminus**
Historic plaque marks the end of the original transcontinental route.
