Events on Historic Route 6 – September 18–24, 2025

Head west to **Scranton**, **Pennsylvania**, and you'll find the **West Scranton Fall Festival** (Sept 19–21). Local music, food vendors, and neighborhood pride give this festival a genuine small-town feel. It's the kind of community gathering where visitors are welcomed like locals, making it a warm stop on your Route 6 road trip.

In **Sandusky**, **Ohio**, the **Osborn Fall Fest** takes place September 20. Food lovers will also want to stop in **lowa City, lowa**, on September 20 for the **Northside Oktoberfest and BrewFest**. And if you find yourself in Nevada on September 20, hop aboard the **Taste of Italy Dinner Train** with the **Nevada Northern Railway** in Ely.
